



Dear Mrs. Blitch:

It is understood that the House Rivers and Harbors Subcommittee is expected to hold an executive meeting within the next week to act on H. R. 9540, the Blatnik bill to extend and strengthen the federal Water Pollution Control Act. The bill must then be approved by the full Public Works Committee.

Passage of the Water Pollution Control Bill is an absolute must. Your support of this measure is ernestly requested as is the active support of all our Georgia Representatives in the Congress.

The Georgia Water Laws Revision Commission has been holding a series of public hearings throughout the state. The writer as president of the Georgia Conservation League has participated in these hearings to make certain that the interest of the sportsmen. commercial fishermen, conservationist, and the recreation-seeking public, whose interest are dependant upon pollution-free waters, are properly reflected and defended.

These hearings have disclosed the fact that the Georgia Chamber of Commerce is violently opposed to any water legislation, making it illegal to allow industry to pollute our waters, to the detriment of the welfare of this state. This is not opinion but is a matter of record. I debated the issue with Mr. Walter Cates, Executive Vice-President, Georgia Chamber of Commerce, who wishes to reduce the issues to whether or not Georgia is to have "catfish or industry". Should the issues come to a vote, Mr. Cates representing the Chamber of Commerce of this state, did make the statement that he would vote for industry. Such an attitude to this writer is treasonable
